



## Travel Guide – ANSE Summer University 18th – 22nd August 2025

Please find hereby some tips and useful information about your travel arrangements regarding airport transfers and public transportation in Munich.

### Public transportation

Public transport is very good in Munich, it is worth using it when within the city.

### Airport-Shuttle-Service: Express Bus

Should you opt for flying, you shall arrive to Munich Airport. Please note that most service providers and their employees speak some level of English, however, if you encounter any difficulties, you may ask for help from other passengers or pedestrians.

Lufthansa Express shuttle bus is providing a direct, convenient, economical and fast connection between Munich Airport and Munich Main-Station, Arnulfstraße 12. The buses run around the clock, every 20 minutes, it takes 45 min for the journey to Munich Main-Station. Further information and the timetable you'll find [here](#). The Airport shuttle bus single ticket is 12,00 €.



### S-Bahn / Munich Transport Network (MVV)

The S1 and S8 S-Bahn lines connect the airport to the Munich city center at 10-minute intervals. The S1 travels via the west of the city and the S8 via the east. The trip to the main railway station at the city center takes approx. 40 minutes.



Terminal 1 and 2 are closest to the first station of the S1 and S8 lines

The state capital has an excellent developed public transport network. The most important means of transport in Munich are:

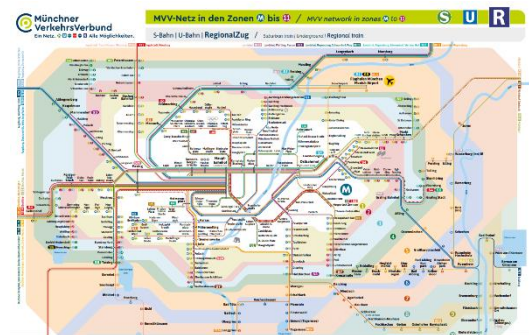
1. U-Bahn = subway
2. Tram
3. S-Bahn = Suburban railway
4. Bus

## MVV Munich

## Tickets

There are several types of tickets and passes available, it is worth considering what you might need. You can check out the details of all options [here](#).

- Details for single tickets [here](#), (3,90 €) (short trip ride)
- Details for a stripe ticket [here](#). (17,00 €, 2 stripes are needed for a short trip ride like Main-Station until station East)
- Details for a day-Card for a group (2-5 P.) [here](#) (17,80 €)
- Details for a City-Tour-Card for a group (2 – 5 P.) [here](#)

## Example

From Munich Main Station to Munich Station East it is a short trip ride.

- Single-Ticket= 3,90 €
- 2 stripes of a stripe ticket are 3,40 €

More Options during your stay:

- I. Day-Card divided of 2 Persons = 8,90 € p.P. (incl. return journey on the same day)
- II. City-Tour-Card for example 3 days and 3 people: 47,90€ / 3 days / 3 people: 5,30 € p.P./ p. day for all rides in Zone M.
- III. Single journey: € 3.90 in the city area M (main station to station Munich East)
- IV. Day ticket for a group (2 - 5 people): € 17.80
- V. Strip ticket (10 strips): 17.80 €, you need 2 strips from the main station to station Munich East = 3.56 € per journey
